Examples of God's Patience:

- The Flood-God announced judgment, then waited years before executing that judgment
- 2) Israel's Rebellion-God gave Israel chance after chance to return to Him
- 3) King Manasseh-He was the worst king Israel ever had, yet he had the longest reign. He finally repented and returned to God.
- (4) Saul of Tarsus-Although he persecuted the church, God was patience until it was time for him to repent.

Examples of Jesus' Patience:

- 2) Patience with situations and circumstances-Jesus faced many hardships as an travelling preacher with no home, yet He was patient no matter the situation. He also patiently waited for His Father's timing and will.
- 3) Patience with suffering-Jesus could have saved Himself from suffering and death, yet He patiently went to the cross for our sake (see 1 Peter 2:21-24)
