#### How the study will work:

There are ten lessons in this study. Before you begin, you will need to download and print this study pack. It contains the worksheets for all ten lessons.

We'll be using the CRAVE Bible study method, because my hope is that this short study will cause you to crave more of God's Word There are several steps to the study, but some of them are optional. However, the more time you invest in the study, the more you will get out of it.

#### FOR EACH LESSON:

- 1. Copy the passage. Simply handwrite the verse/passage into a journal or on the back of the worksheet.
- 2. Read the passage. Read it slowly and deliberately, focusing on the meaning of each word. It may also help to read it from various translations. You can find them online from sites like <u>Bible Hub</u> or <u>BibleGateway</u> if you don't have any other translations at home to refer to.
- 3. **A**nswer the questions. There is a worksheet with the lesson's verse or passage and a series of questions to answer to help you dig deeper into the text.
- 4. View the video. I'll be posting a short video on my blog for each lesson to help you understand the passage better. You can find those videos here:
- 5. Engage the passage. Once you are familiar with what the passage is saying and what it means, think about some ways that you can apply the passage personally to your life. There are questions included on the worksheet to help you.
